Aims of education			
This course provides an introduction to the main ideas of jurisprudence, legal theory, and the philosophy of law. It is designed to introduce students to			

the law and basic legal language as well as to make them aware of key principles of the legal reasoning and argument, legal rights, law-making process, application of the law, it's interpretation. Students will also be introduced to the main disciplines of the Polish law.

Course contents

1. The concept and basic functions of law and it's relation to other normative standards of behaviour.
2. Law as a phenomenon examined by legal scholars (legal sciences)
3. Legal norms and legal provisions
4. Legal acts and the process of enactment of law (legislation)
5. Validity and binding character of law
6. Legal system. Statutory law (civil law) common law (case law) and customary law
7. Interpretation of law
8. Application and enforcement of law
9. Legal ethics and legal professions
10. The Polish legal system - genesis
11. Introduction to Polish Constitutional Law
12. Introduction to Polish Civil Law and Proceedings
13. Introduction to Polish Family Law and the Law of Succession
14. Introduction to Polish Criminal Law and Proceedings
15. Introduction to Polish Administrative Law and Proceedings
