Aims of education

This course will consider a range of issues in contemporary philosophy of law with particular emphasis on the concept of the so-called hard cases. The main goal of the course is to raise awareness of theoretical problems involved in understanding the law as well as practical problems of its creation and application. Students' attention will be focused on the problems occurring in case of a clash of law with other normative systems and the conflict of law with itself. We will look carefully at philosophical problems arising in a number of highly contested contemporary legal and social issues.

Course contents

- 1. What is philosophy of law? Philosophical problems in law.
- 2. Theory of hard cases. Different concepts.
- 3. Law and morality in cannibalistic cases. R v. Dudley and Stephens. L.L. Fuller's The Case of the Speluncean Explorers.
- 4. Law vs. new technologies: autonomous cars and liability. Elaine Herzberg case.
- 5. Law vs. religion: Scopes monkey trial.
- 6. Law vs. human rights: The ticking bomb scenario and the legitimization of torture.
- 7. Legal moralism and paternalism. Lawrence vs. Texas.
- 8. Summary: Do hard cases make bad law?
