Aims of education

The aim of the course is to present current trends and challenges of IP law and analyses how the fourth industrial revolution changes the framework of intellectual property rights in the context of data, technological development and digital environment. Artificial Intelligence, Big data and data mining, Internet of Things, smart contracts and blockchains are already affecting business models and leading to social and economic transformation in IP law. As a result revisiting a traditional approach to IP legal system and the protection of inventions is needed to face the current changes. The course also aims to introduce students to the basic principles of intellectual property law in the information society, including international and European Union law. To present the challenges of evaluating intellectual property law in the digital environment, taking into account the development of new technologies, human rights, especially the respect for freedom of expression and privacy, ethics and access to content on the Internet.

The course covers issues of international and EU intellectual property law - legal regulations with reference to case law.
